Whilst visiting Hart & Fleet clubs recently District Governor Pat and Lion Eric took the opportunity to call in and meet the children and mums at Stepping Stones. DG Pat has supported Stepping

Stones since hearing founder member Emma Hall speak at Hart Charter last year.

Stepping Stones is a support group for the families of children with Down syndrome and is based in Hartley Wintney near Fleet in the North East of Hampshire.

The group which started with 2 mums and 2 children has grown to 20 member families in just over a year.

The area lacked any support network for these families so the group now provides a meeting once a month, outings for the families, educational workshops, speech therapy, and the knowledge that there is someone at the end of the phone who understands.

Emma Hall has recently compiled a booklet which will be handed out by maternity units when a baby is diagnosed with Down syndrome. This booklet is called 'Our Stories' and tells the story of each of the children who attend the group. It is a positive look at the future and is certainly inspiring. Lion Marilyn Robson

Burnham Lions' Young Ambassador to Serve Cambodia and Ghana.



In 2006/2007 the Lions Club of Burnham choose Emily Shaw as a Young Ambassador for her various voluntary work with young people and was delighted when she went on to become the district winner of a substantial monetary prize which she donated to local youth causes.

Members were therefore pleased when Emily recently attended a Lions Club meeting to update them on her progress and of her exciting plans to serve others in the immediate future.

Not for her the life of a teenager lying in bed ordering in pizza. Instead, she has been working at a local school as a Learning Assistant caring for a little girl with aspergers. She is also a volunteer at the Learning Lab, a home work club for young people and their parents.

Whilst busily volunteering she has also been working in the evenings to earn money to self fund her gap year when she wishes to put her considerable experience of helping young people to good use.

Emily is now about to leave for Cambodia, where for two weeks she will be teaching English in a school of two hundred students, set up by monks for street children. There are class sizes of 12-40 and the pupils' age range is from 5-20.

Later this summer Emily will be spending two months in Ghana. She will be working in an orphanage and living with a local family. There are between 20 and 30 children in the orphanage who have lost their families either through death, abuse or abandonment. The orphanages are basic, with children having to sleep on bare concrete floor and often food is scarce and very few toys. Emily's role will be to plan and provide activities for the children. These may be sport or musical related. She will also be involved in the general care of the children.

Emily wants to be able to take with her really practical gifts for the children to try and enhance their lives such as exercise books, pencils, basic picture books and puzzles for the children. Such items can have an incredible impact upon disadvantaged communities.

The Lions Club of Burnham will help fulfil Emily's wish list and has the advantage of the knowledge and experience of Kebba Cham a mature student from the Gambia, who is being supported by the club in his studies at university furthering his skills in caring for the both blind and deaf. He attends most club meetings and was able to give advice on what is really needed.

Emily has proved a very worthy Ambassador and we wish her well.

Christchurch Lions Help Local Children



Christchurch Lion President Liz Poole handed over a cheque for £1000 to Jae Harris who runs Christchurch Activities for Young People. The money will enable needy youngsters to join in a range of holiday activities run by Jae during the school breaks.

Pool e Lions Celebrate 30 years of Swimarathon



Poole Lions Club held their 30th annual Swimarathon at the Dolphin Swimming Pool on the weekend of 2nd/3rd February 2008 which raised £25,000 for local

good causes and with a further £5,000 of pledges and charity matched funds to come in, the organisers, Poole Lions Club, were in a grateful mood.

Lion President Harold Brown, who has been Swimarathon Chairman since 1995 and involved in all but three of the annual events, said: "It went really well and this year and we hope to meet our Target of £30,000. We had tremendous assistance from Poole Soroptimists and the Rotary Club of Poole Bay, who helped on the organising committee and manning the pool."

The main recipients were **Julia's House, Portfield School, Medaille Trust, Poole Young Carers (Barnardo's), Chestnut Nursery and Poole Parcels Fund.**

There were youngsters, adults and "We even had a Springer Spaniel called Gemma who raised over £550 by swimming in a dog pool." said Harold Brown. Altogether we had 133 teams and over 800 swimmers from as young as five and as mature as 75. The oldest team boasted a total age of 450 for the six swimmers
