The Lucas Resuscitation Machines-Update 18th Feb 2009

Since the Zone B meeting on Thurs 12 Feb I have received an update for the Lucas new EU Trial.

The New Trial started some 4-6 wks ago and Dorset is leading the trial which is going very well. They are testing larger machines which run on compressed air. These have a running time of 30 minutes per cylinder as opposed to the earlier units that used Oxygen as a propellant lasting just 8-9 minutes. The old machines are in use and have been modified to take either propellant.

The Trial is conducted similar to all clinical trials. This means that the use of a Lucas machine is decided at random. The Ambulance crew open an envelope which instructs them to use Lucas or not. This does not in any way prevent them from using it, except that if the need arises and they use a machine, these results do not count towards the trial. The reason for explaining this point is that the trial is data quantity and quality driven, and not on a strict time scale. This means that it could take up to approximately 3 years duration, unless it is shortened. There are more units out there than the last trial.

I have asked for more information on our behalf, and expressed our ongoing concerns regarding holding monies collected specifically for Lucas and held in trust. Informing them that our legal adviser has said "That monies collected from the public specifically in the name of Lucas must be held until the trial is complete" If then Lucas is approved fine. If "Lucas" is scraped or say an alternative is found then a decision will have to be made at that time.

I will inform Region 1 and Zones 1a & 1b chairman, and all club secretaries in region1 of any information I receive as a matter of urgency.

Lions home for family in Sri Lanka



Five Lions Clubs from the Reading have donated a total of £5,000 to build a sturdv brick built bungalow home in Beruwela, South West Sri Lanka which is one of the many towns devastated in tsunami on Boxing

Day 2004. The Lions Clubs of Reading, Woodley & Earley, Wokingham, Bracknell and Goring, Woodcote & District each donated £1,000 to the Reading Initiative for Tsunami Action (RITA), which has been working in Sri Lanka since the disaster.

The Lions involvement in this fundraising project was as a result of the Presidents from local Lions Clubs meeting the RITA Trustees in 2007, and they then took the idea back to their members of raising money to build a new house for a family made homeless by the tsunami. The RITA chairman Councillor Bet Tickner with Ben Mitchell of Peter Brett Associates who founded the project received the cheque from the Lions last month at Sonning Golf Club. Cllr Tickner said "This is particularly appropriate when our partners in Beruwela, who get the building work done, include the local Lions Club. As chair of RITA, I can only say it's been great to work with the Lions and they know they've made a creative idea turn into a family home."

The money has paid for the complete building and fitting out of the bungalow which will be allocated to a family made homeless by the 2004 Tsunami. RITA (Reading Initiative for Tsunami Action) charity bought a plot of land after the disaster, with the sole purpose of building a total of 12 homes on it for affected families. Families are drawn from all groups in society, regardless of faith or background. Reading Borough Council have endorsed this Charity and Cllr Tickner is one of several associated members who have visited the developing "estate" of bungalows, and met some of the families helped so far. To date eight of the 12 bungalows are in use or nearing completion.

Fishing Festival lands a big one!

In the depths of January the Meon Valley Lions once again supported the Ford Sports Sea Angling Club with their

annual charity fishing festival on Weston Shore, Southampton. Although the Ford club's own Mark Ramsay carried off the top prize of £600 on the day of the event, the real winner was the Naomi House charity.

During the recent prize presentation ceremony at Ford's Southampton Sports and Social Club, Peter Oates (Ford SAC organiser) and Ron Wilson Secretary of Meon Valley Lions, presented a cheque for £1,800 to the Winchester based, children's hospice charity. Thanks to the hard work of the Ford Sports SAC and the Lions, plus the generous support of the Transport & General Workers Union, the cheque matched last year's previous effort, taking the total raised for Naomi House to around £27,000 in the 34 years since the event began.

Accepting the donation on behalf of Naomi House, Mary Rochford, Chair of the Solent Fund Raising group expressed her thanks and said, "We understand these are difficult and uncertain economic times, especially for workers at Ford and it is therefore even more fantastic that everyone has been able to continue to support our Charity in this way. Naomi House has also been a victim of the economic recession, losing significant investment funding for a new building as a result of the Icelandic banking crisis, so the cheque has come at just the right time."

A record-breaking £135,000

was raised at the Lions Club of Jersey's Swimarathon which took place between the 4-8th March at Les

Quennevais Sports Centre. The event attracted more participating teams than ever before and approximately 3,000 swimmers took to the water in the five day event which was also supported by commercial sponsors RBC Wealth Management.

This year the principal beneficiary of the money raised will be Channel Islands Air Search, originally a project of the Lions Club of Guernsey in 1982. The funds will be used to provide anti-collision radar for the organisation's aircraft *Lions Pride*, an essential requirement for search and rescue operations in the hazardous waters around the Channel Islands.

Lion Nick Sangan, president of the Lions Club of Jersey, was very impressed by the dedication shown by everyone involved with the Swimarathon. "We had an excellent response to this year's event despite a background of economic gloom. Notwithstanding the more than 420 teams taking part have managed to raise this amazing sum. This is a fantastic reflection of the public of Jersey's commitment to helping local charities," he said. "As well as providing new equipment for *Lions Pride*, the Lions Club of Jersey will use the money raised to invest in many other local projects which support the wider community."

Ever since the Swimarathon started in 1972, moneys from that event, and other Lions' fundraising, have provided free holidays for Islanders at Maison des Landes Hotel for the Disabled which itself has been a Lions Club project since 1965. "The hotel caters largely for disabled guests and their carers from the United Kingdom and has received considerable sums from past Swimarathons to pay for refurbishment development," says Lion Sangan, "But at the beginning and end of each season we use Swimarathon money to provide free holidays for local people who might otherwise never be able to contemplate such a break.' The team raising the largest amount in this year's Swimarathon was that entered by the Government House team, led by the Island's Lt Governor, Lt General Andrew Ridgway, and his wife Valerie (who both swam). The team, 'The Royal Seals' raised more than £27,000. Ends.
