The DG's Ponderings



Like many of you my pre Christmas plans did not work out as I would have wished! Snow saw many clubs, especially in the north of the District. having to cancel some of their Christmas activities.

Whilst clubs will have lost some money, I do believe we those that cancelled events, took the right decisions as the conditions pavements and many side roads meant venturing out would have been very foolish.

We all hoped for better things in the New Year but again snow interrupted plans! I was unable to carry out 6 planned club visits but I have now completed 1 and the others have been re timetabled.

#### 1. Youth



One event which did take place was the Young Ambassador/Youth Symposium in Bournemouth. Congratulations to DO Lion Richard High for all his efforts in making this such a success. Also congratulations must go our to Ambassador for 2010 Rebecca Bellworthy and the Eastleigh Club for supporting her. We wish her well in the MD finals in Dudley in February. The Young Leader in Service Award is due to be

re-launched in the Multiple District. I know that some Lions and clubs feel that there are too many Youth projects but I would ask vou to consider this idea very carefully as it could be used to help individuals in our communities and could lead to finding candidates for other projects. It could also lead to increased interest in Lions and possibly more members.

#### 2. National Arboretum

Many clubs have supported the appeal for the shelter at The National Arboretum and I thank them for doing so. If you have not already done so, please consider making a pledge to this very worthwhile and useful project which will be a wonderful memorial to 60 years of Lionism.

#### 3. Haiti

As we all know the earthquake in Haiti is an enormous disaster affecting hundreds thousands of people. The survivors are facing tremendous problems. The other evening a survivor was shown being rescued after being buried for over 7 days. He was expected to leave hospital in a couple of days but where would he be going? He and so many others have nothing. What are the Lions doing? Whilst we are not essentially a Disaster Relief Agency. LCIF made an immediate grant of \$50,000 within hours of the earthquake. Local Lions are being aided by groups from all over the world and Sweden for example, have sent 200 tents to provide shelter and \$900,000 had been contributed by Lions clubs as at 26th January. The Chairman of LCIF AI Brandel and his wife Dr Maureen Murphy are currently in Haiti helping to distribute aid and to discuss what can be done in the future. Lions will be there for many years to come helping to rebuild the homes and infrastructure in what is a very poor country, All this will need money and, if you have not done so, I would urge all clubs to consider making a donation to LCIF via our District Treasurer. We know that this money will be used by Lions for Lions and that every pound will be used to help those suffering so much. Please see the LCI website for up to date detail.

4. Good Ideas Lions Hope for Haiti Appeal Lion President Tony Baker has told me that New Milton Lions are to open a Charity Shop from 5th to 13th February at 110 Station Road especially to raise funds for the Haiti appeal. They are leafleting their area asking for quality items that people may like to offer, for them to sell but not electrical items or large Furniture. New Milton would welcome contributions from other clubs which should be brought to the shop on Friday 5th February or visit the shop which will be open until Saturday 13th February, to buy.

#### 5. District Convention 2010.

This is getting very close now. It is to be at Wokefield Park, near Reading from 19th to 21st March. Fleet Lions are continuing to work very hard to ensure this is a first class event.
