The Convention business session was interesting with some good debate on many of the topics, particularly the Resolutions, for those interested the following being carried Resolution 1. 2. 4. 5. 6. and Emergency

resolution E1 (Payment of fares of partners of District Governors Elect to International Convention) This has arisen due to Lions Clubs International deciding at it's meeting held 9-14th March 2009 to impose an upper limit of USD500 reimbursement from 2010 Australia and will enable the Multiple District to make up the shortfall, until this change, partners fares have been met in full by Lions Clubs International, because Partners are required to attend, this is the only time that partners travel is reimbursed during the Governors year of office.

The following resolutions were rejected by Convention, Resolution 3. 7 & 8 the resolutions were circulated to all Clubs prior to the Convention, however, if further clarification is required, please ask.

Zone Chairman for Zones 1B and 5M 2009-2010 now needed urgently

DG(E) Lion Judith has now been able to appoint officers to all cabinet posts for 2009-2010 with the exception of Zone Chairman for Zones 1B and 5M it is an LCI requirement that a District must be divided into Zones each with a Zone Chairman to serve for a year, can I therefore extend an urgent appeal for the clubs in the respective Zones to decide on a Zone Chairman to take on this role for the ensuing year, you should have served as Club President for a year or greater part of a year at some time in the past, the duties are to visit each Club in the Zone at least once and hold at least three Zone meetings in the year.

The Zone chairman is invited to attend Cabinet meetings if they so wish, but this is not mandatory a written report can instead be sent to the Region Chairman for inclusion in the Cabinet papers, a contribution towards all reasonable traveling expenses will be reimbursed.

Even if you have been asked before and turned it down in the past, can I please urge you to reconsider and make contact with Lion Judith as soon as possible so that details can be included in the District and MD Directories, I urge you, please don't allow your Zones to be let down, please come forward in support of Lion Judith.
